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Barnstorming, Incorporated, and its Board of Directors has asked the City of Eureka to terminate the cooperation and lease agreement regarding the placement of the restored Davidson Barn at Eureka Lake Park where it would have served as a community center and home of the Woodford County Historical Society. Reasons for this action include organized public opposition, primarily from residents living in proximity to the park, both within the city limits and outside. This opposition was manifested most recently at a June 20 town hall meeting at the Pavilion sponsored by the mayor. Furthermore, attempts to identify and secure an alternate site, both with the beauty and topographic features offered by the Eureka Lake site, and being contiguous with or within the City boundaries were not fruitful.

Writing in response, City Administrator Melissa Brown acknowledges that it is impractical to continue a campaign that lacks community support, and goes on to thank us for our dedication to this project.

Likewise, we offer thanks to you, as one of our donors, for helping to launch this project. Funds now remaining in our bank account, and any more accruing thereto, will be offered to our Architect in partial payment for his time and services spent on design work for this project. We plan to keep this account open for this purpose until the Spring of 2019, when a final payment will be made, the account closed, and Barnstorming, Incorporated, will be dissolved.
